## Current Article of APACA

### Chair and Vice-Chair

#### Article 7.

The Chair and two Vice-Chairs should be elected among the Members at the General Assembly for a period of two years. The Chair and two Vice-Chairs may stand for re-election at the end of their term of office. The election shall be executed in a secret ballot if requested by at least one Member. Nomination for the positions of Chair or two Vice-Chairs must be made in writing to all Members.

One Vice-Chair should serve as a secretariat of the Association.

# Proposed Modification to the Current Article of APACA

## Chair and Vice-Chair

### **Article 7.**

The Chair and two Vice-Chairs should be elected among the Members at the General Assembly for a period of two years. The Chair and two Vice-Chairs may stand for re-election at the end of their term of office. The election shall be executed in a secret ballot if requested by at least one Member. Nomination for the positions of Chair or two Vice-Chairs must be made in writing to all Members.

One Vice-Chair should serve as a secretariat of the Association.

### **Article 7-(1).**

If two out of three executives (one chair and two vice chairs) step down before the two years term, the emergency election should be held.

# Voting, Quorum of APACA

## Voting, Quorum

### Article 9.

Only Members shall be entitled to vote at the General Assembly of the Members. If there are multiple Members in one economy, only one vote representing one economy is valid.

A Member can give ..... (Omission).....

.....by the General Assembly.

### Decisions relating to:

- amendments to the Articles of Association,
- the admission and the exclusion of Members or Associate Members,
- the dissolution of the Association,

must have two-thirds of the votes cast by the General Assembly provided that half of the Members shall be present or represented.
